

2. Providing mentorship to new trainers, such as through collaborative planning and co-facilitation of programs by more experienced trainers with new trainers;
3. Translating existing training materials into Inuktitut or customizing existing programs to better serve Inuit participants;
4. Expanding or strengthening existing programs that have been successful, such as by:
 - Developing, piloting, and evaluating new components;
 - Researching options for expansion or improvement; or,
 - Developing a business case to expand delivery to other regions or target groups;
5. Developing, piloting, and evaluating new programs or learning resources; and,
6. Researching Nunavut-specific promising practices, conducting capacity assessments, and gathering other information that would support Inuit-specific program design and planning.

Priority will be given to projects that will be wholly or substantially funded by contributions from Makigiaqta. The Program is not designed for larger projects that significantly exceeds the Program's maximum limit or where funding from this Program will constitute only a small portion of the budget of the proposed project.

3.3 Amounts and Budget

The maximum limit for each eligible project is \$250,000 (including any applicable GST or administrative costs), under a total program budget of \$1,000,000 each fiscal year.

3.4 Eligible Expenses

Type of eligible expenses will be provided in the Guidelines.

4. SELECTION AND APPEAL

4.1 Program Committee

Applications for funding from the Contribution Program will be reviewed and decided by the Program Committee. The Committee or the Division may request additional information from an applicant.

4.2 Contribution Agreement

All successful applicants are required to enter into contribution agreements before receiving funding from Makigiaqta. NTI's Chief Executive Officer may, in the contribution agreement, require additional terms and conditions that he or she deems appropriate based on the nature of the project and circumstances.

4.3 Appeals

Any applicant who believes that this Policy and the Guidelines are not properly followed can appeal the decision of the Program Committee to NTI President. The decision of the NTI President is final.

5. MONITORING AND REVIEW

5.1 Monitoring

The Division will monitor the compliance of this Policy, Guidelines, terms and conditions in the contribution agreements, and the effectiveness of the projects funded by the Program.

5.2 Review

This Program will be reviewed every five (5) years at the discretion of the Board of Directors.
